Synonyms are words which have the same or nearly the same meanings. Learning synonyms will help you expand your vocabulary.

Examples

Susie was sad when her cat died.

Susie was heartbroken when her cat died.

The words 'sad' and 'heartbroken' are synonyms.

Here is a list of synonyms:

generous - benevolent, charitable, magnanimous

explain - clarify, define, elucidate

visible – noticeable, obvious, evident

issue – concern, problem, controversy

trouble - commotion, disorder, predicament

imagine – fantasize, visualize, fabricate

listless – lethargic, lifeless, sluggish

malicious - spiteful, venomous, vicious

As no two words have the exact same meaning, you should take note how each synonym differs in meaning from the others and select the most appropriate one to suit the context of the sentence.

Example

Here are three synonyms: false, counterfeit, fictitious

It was a **false** rumour that the principal was going to retire.

The traveller was arrested for carrying **counterfeit** cigarettes.

She used **fictitious** names in her book about survivors of the tsunami.

Word	Meaning
false	not true
counterfeit	made in imitation so as to trick people into believing they are getting the genuine product e.g. counterfeit branded goods
fictitious	not real

An antonym is a word that has an almost opposite meaning to that of another word.

Examples

Obesity is a **major** health problem in many parts of the world.

The victim of the accident suffered only **minor** injuries.

Here is a list of antonyms:

outgoing-reservedsuperior-inferiorcreate-destroyextravagant -miserlynegligible-significantaggravate -amelioratepermanent-temporarybliss-woe

A word with several different meanings often has a matching antonym that suits each sense of the word.

Example

Sense 1

Clara is usually a **confident** girl, but she seemed quite **timid** among the crowd of distinguished visitors at the award ceremony today.

Sense 2

While Tom is a **confident** speaker, Lionel appears **incapable** of managing a simple sentence in Mandarin.

Sense 3

The organisers are **confident** of a strong turnout for the marathon, but they are quite **unsure** that the weather will be fine.

Here are the 3 different meanings of confident:

Sense 1	self-assured
Sense 2	capable
Sense 3	certain, sure
